Once set up correctly, dealing with The Wand ensemble is a very pleasant thing. For a unpivot, the arm feels extremely solid in operation and the best thing about it is: the sonic result fully justifies the effort, ... Paul Simon's Graceland? With the title track you can immediately hear the crisp and disciplined gait that is inherent in the Ikeda cartridge and is presented here without any problems. The drums have substance, but still sound feathery. The timing with the bass fits perfectly, the title swings completely uninhibited. In fact, its looseness is suspiciously reminiscent of what the great AIE direct drive also delivers so convincingly. The transparency of the African rhythms is really breathtaking, and the multitude of singing voices are divided well. Great thing! the large number of singing voices are also very well resolved.
